



Tomtit

Petroica macrocephala (Gmelin, 1789)

Length: 13cm

Weight: 11g

Similar species: North Island robin, South Island robin

New Zealand status: Endemic

Conservation status: Not Threatened

A small songbird with a large head and small black tail. Adult males have a black head, upper breast and back, black wings with a white bar, and white underparts. Females are duller, with brown-and-white rather than black-and-white. In the South, Chatham and Auckland Islands, males have some yellow/orange colouration on the breast, both sexes have a white spot above the bill.

Voice: both sexes make short "seet", "zet" or "swee" contact calls throughout the year, most often given singularly, but up to five in quick succession.
