

Code of Conduct for the Photography of Birds

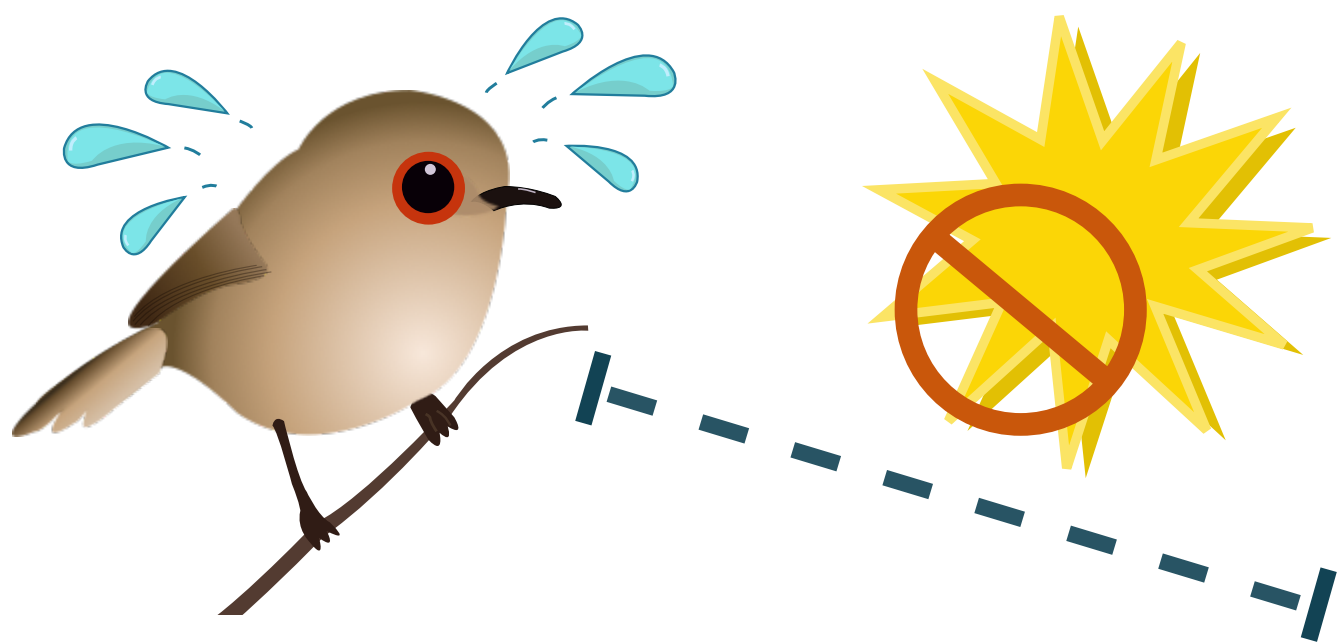
Aims

- (a) To increase awareness of potential negative impacts that photography (the capture of images via still or moving camera, mobile device, drone, trail camera, or other) may have on birds.
- (b) To ensure respect for the security and welfare of birds and to minimise interference to birds and to the surrounding environment during photography.

1. The security and welfare of birds takes precedence



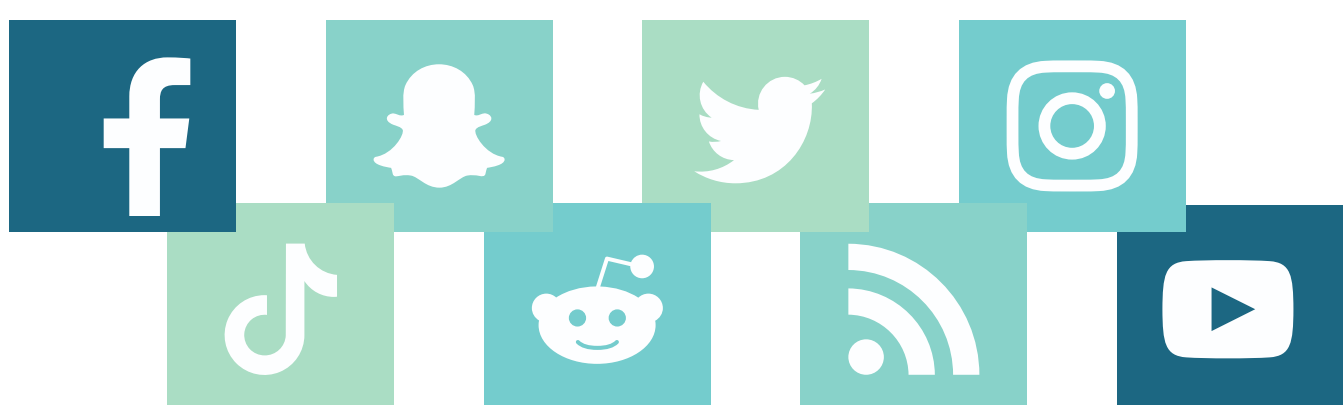
2. Minimise stress to birds



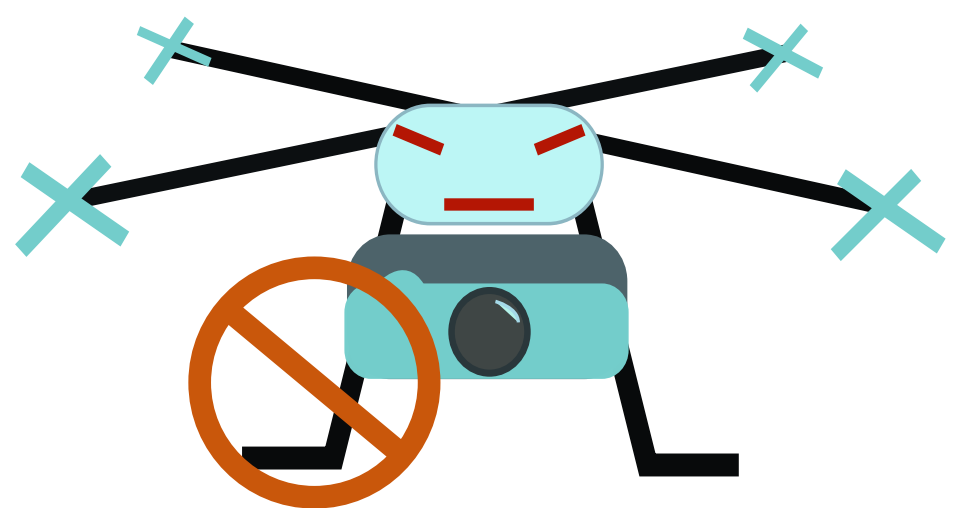
3. Attractants are discouraged



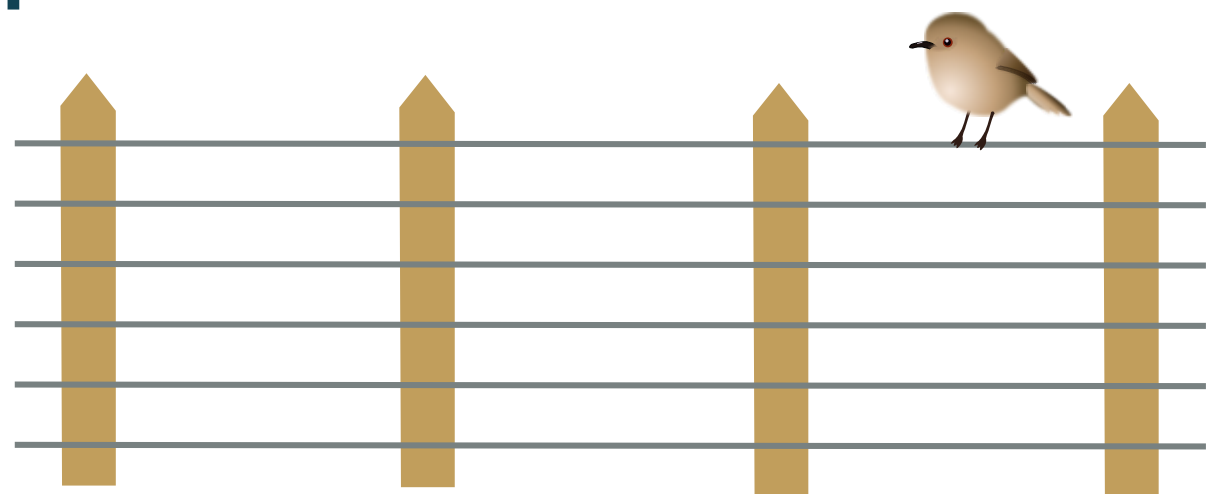
4. Be mindful when posting to social media



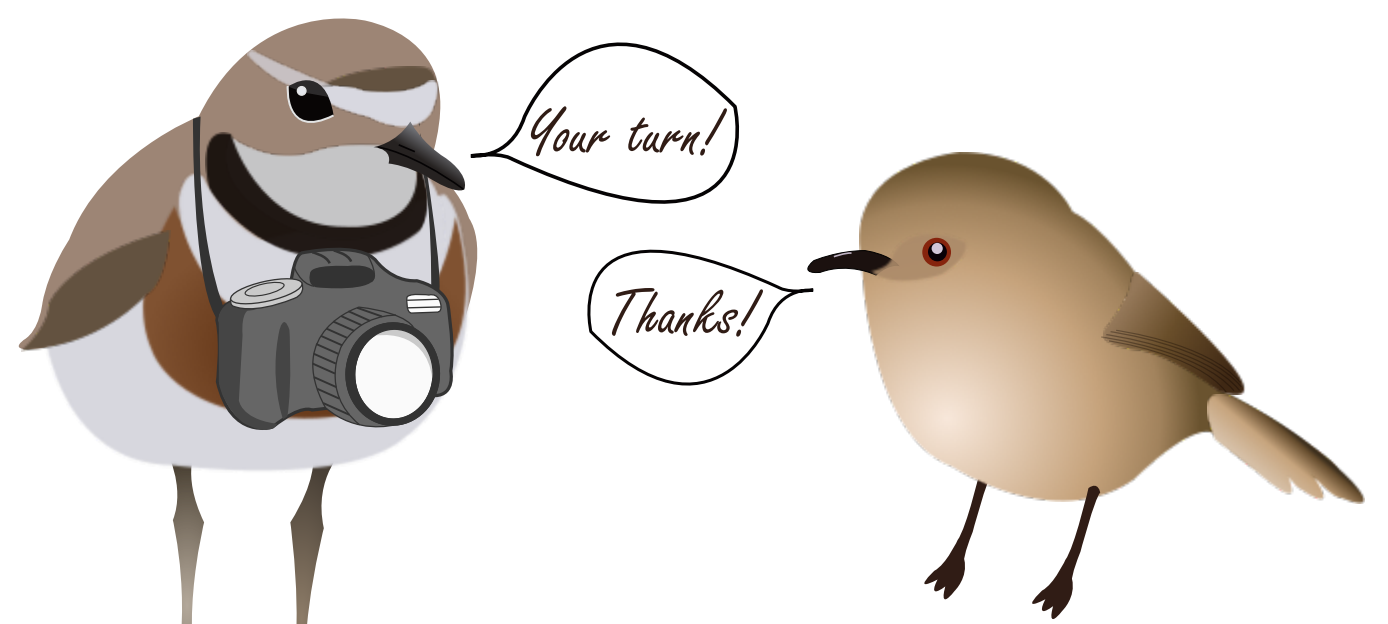
5. Drone use for photography is not recommended
